

How To Use This Book

This book is designed to help small children, young people of any age, or adults, so that **anyone interested in memorizing the Bible verses may do so.** It is so important to hide the Word of God in our hearts that we might not sin against God (Psalm 119:11).

God made a way for you and me to live forever, even after our body dies! This is good news! This book tells who we are, how we got here, and how we may have this everlasting life. It also guides us in victorious daily living and provides special Bible readings on each subject.

On the back of each page are Bible verses to memorize. Learn as many as you can. Say your verses to someone willing to listen—maybe to your mother, your father, teacher, or some interested friend. He or she can sign his or her name as the "listener" to the verses. Learn the verses so well that you can say them without any help.

The "listener" may hold up the picture side to you to help remind you of the Bible verse. This will also help the "listener" to see if you are saying the verse without any mistakes, because in most cases the verses are on the back side.

Every time you say a verse without help and without any mistakes, you may fill in a part of the circle, beginning with number 1. (See page 2.) Practice saying the verse many times correctly to your "listener," and each time fill in a part of the circle. When you have said a verse correctly 8 times, the circle will be all filled in. Now go to the next verse, memorize that verse, and fill in the circle for verse two, the same as you did for verse one, and so on.

When you have done all the circles on each page of this book, begin on page one again. Review the verses and say them without help to your "listener" again. This time complete the squares, beginning with number 9. When you have said the verse correctly another 8 times, the square will be complete.

May you have much JOY in using this special book designed to help you know the Word of God!



To complete the circle means you have said the verse correctly to your "listener" 8 times without help. Fill in only one space of a circle for each time you say your verse correctly. The circle spaces are numbered 1-8 for you. Start with number 1.



When the circle is finished for each verse you decided to learn, go to the next page and memorize the verses on the back of that page. Fill in only the circles as you did on this page. Keep on going through all the pages in this manner until you have finished every page. Now you may start at the beginning of this book again. Review and practice your verses. Say them to your "listener" and this time when you say the verse correctly, fill in the spaces of each square which are numbered from 9-16. By the time your square is completed you should really have the verse "hidden in your heart" (Psalm 119:11).

Your "listener" may put a check mark (>) by his or her signature to show you have said the verses another 8 times correctly.



All Age Groups:

(Verse 1) Genesis 1:26 — "And God said, let us make man in Our image . . ."

Older Youth and Adults:

(Verse 2) Genesis 2:7—"And the LORD God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and man became a living soul."

A living soul means we shall always be somewhere forever and ever. Since man was made a living soul this makes man different from any other living thing! God did not breathe into the nostrils of the animals; therefore we are not like the beasts of the field. This shows a man could not have come from a monkey or any other animal!

(Verse 3) I Corinthians 15:39 — "All flesh is not the same flesh: but there is one kind of flesh of men, another flesh of beasts, another of fishes, and another of birds."



All Age Groups:

(Verse 1) Romans 5:12 — "... by one man sin entered into the world, and death by sin; and so death passed upon all men..."

The glory of the Lord departed from Adam and Eve when they disobeyed God. For the first time they realized they were naked and they wanted to hide from God. Adam and Eve knew they had done wrong. Disobedience to God's command brought sin and death into this beautiful world. From that day to this, every person is born with the sin nature in his or her heart, and will someday die because death came by sin. (See your verse above.)

Older Youth and Adults:

(Verse 2) Romans 3:23—"For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God."

Disobedience still brings death and separation from God today (Isaiah 59).

(Verse 3) Romans 6:16 — "Know ye not, that to whom ye yield yourselves servants to obey, his servants ye are to whom ye obey; whether of sin unto death, or of obedience unto righteousness?"

Something To Think About

(Other names for that old serpent are the devil and Satan. Revelation 12:9) Satan, the enemy of our soul, is a **big liar**. We should never listen to him. It never pays to listen to the devil.







Something to Remember

WHY JESUS CAN SAVE US FROM OUR SINS



Jesus had no human father. The Holy Ghost is His Father. This is why His blood is divine and this is why He could die on the cross for our sins. Jesus was a perfect sacrifice for sins because He had no sin. Jesus is pure and holy. Jesus especially came to this earth to save us from our sins! That is why we can call Him our Saviour. He came to save us.

God's Lamb, Jesus Christ, is the only perfect sacrifice.

THIS SACRIFICE IS FOR ALL TIME—ONCE FOR ALL. (Read pages 22 and 26.)

The last words of Jesus on the cross were: "It is finished"-John 19:30.

GOD LOVES YOU! CALVARY PROVES IT!

"... while we were vet sinners. Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).

"Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world" (John 1:29).

Christ's death was no accident. It was part of God's plan. John 3:14, 15— "And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up: that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." These were the words of Jesus.

- I Peter 1:18, 19—We are redeemed by His precious blood, as of a lamb without spot.
- 112 Matthew 20:17-19—Christ tells ahead of time about His death.
- 112 Luke 9:22—Christ's death is not an accident.
- Matthew 27:11-26—Jesus Christ is delivered to be crucified.
- John 19:4-11—Jesus was in control of His cruel situation.
- 12 Matthew 27:27-38—Jesus is mocked and crucified between two thieves.
- Matthew 27:50-54 and Hebrews 4:14-16—At Christ's death the veil of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. Truly this is the Son of God who has become our High Priest. (See page 26.)


(Verse 1) John 14:6—"Jesus saith unto him, I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by Me."

God's Plan to Save Us Included His Resurrection



What Happens When Our Body Dies?

A. Our spirit goes back to God-the body goes back to dust.

Ecclesiastes 12:7 says: "Then shall the dust return to the earth as it was: and the spirit shall return unto God who gave it."

Ecclesiastes 3:21 clearly shows the spirit of a beast is different from the spirit of a man—"Who knoweth the spirit of man that goeth upward, and the spirit of the beast that goeth downward to earth?" You will remember that on page 4 we learned that God breathed only into man the breath of life so that he became a living soul. This is why our spirit will return to God who gave it.

B. Those who belong to Jesus will be present with Him.

II Timothy 2:19-"... the Lord knoweth them that are His."

II Corinthians 5:8—To be absent from the body is to be present with the Lord.

 $Luke\ 23:43$ —Jesus said to the repentant thief, "... today shalt thou be with Me in paradise."

C. We shall be like the Lord.

David, the Psalmist writes in $Psalm\ 17:15,\ ``...$ I shall be satisfied, when I awake with Thy likeness."

I John 3:2-"We shall be like Him; for we shall see Him as He is."

D. We shall be with the Lord forever.

I Thessalonians 4:13-18—"The dead in Christ shall rise first . . . so shall we ever be with the Lord."

"Choose you this day whom ye will serve" (Joshua 24:15).

CHOOSE CHRIST SO YOU CAN HAVE ETERNAL LIFE (Luke 18:29-30).

REPENTANCE IS NECESSARY

"The Lord is . . . not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance" (II Peter 3:9).

II Corinthians 7:10 says: "... godly sorrow worketh repentance to salvation."



To repent means "sorry enough to quit."






Joy in heaven when a sinner repents

Something to Remember

Without faith it is impossible to please God (Hebrews 11:6).

The most important thing you and I can ever possess is our faith in God for the salvation of our souls. Material wealth, riches, silver and gold, sacrifices of any kind, cannot buy our way to heaven. I Peter 1:18-20 says we are not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, but with the precious BLOOD OF CHRIST. Revelation 5:9 also tells us this.

The work of men's hands cannot redeem us—Psalm 115:4-8, Isaiah 44:8-20. Burnt offerings of calves, rams, or even children will not take away the sin of the soul—Micah 6:6-8.

To burn the sons or daughters of anyone or to cause them to pass through the fire are all vain things. None of these can bring peace to the heart of man. Read Leviticus 18:21; II Kings 16:3; 17:7, 31; 21:6; and II Chronicles 28:3.

The only sacrifice God accepts to put away sin is found in the sacrifice of God's Son, Jesus Christ. Hebrews 9:22-26 explains this clearly. Also see page 26 and page 10 under "Something to Remember."

The blood of bulls and goats cannot take away sins (Hebrews 10:4).

". . . the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin" (I John 1:7). "In whom we have redemption through His blood, even the forgiveness of sins" (Colossians 1:14).

Something to Remember

Christ teaches us that if anyone has anything against us we should go to that person and be reconciled (Matthew 5:23, 24). God requires all wrong doing in our past to be put right (Ecclesiastes 3:15) so it is important to make restitution (amends). Zaccheus did put things right and told the Lord he would restore fourfold (Luke 19:1-10). Some people may not accept our trying to make peace with them . . . but at least we have peace from God. Romans 12:17 and 18 says: "Recompense to no man evil for evil. Provide things honest in the sight of all men. If it be possible, as much as lieth in you, live peaceably with all men." We are not to avenge ourselves for wrongs people do to us. God will do that (Romans 12:19). We are not to render evil for evil or to refuse to pay our just debts. Romans 13:8—"Owe no man any thing, but to love one another: for he that loveth another hath fulfilled the law." If we are followers of that which is good we may escape harm, but if we suffer for righteousness' sake let us forgive those who harm us that they may be ashamed—I Peter 3:12-18. God will judge every secret thing—Ecclesiastes 12:13, 14.

But he, being full of the Holy Ghost, looked up steadfastly into heaven, and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing on the right hand of God, and said, Behold, I see the heavens opened, and the Son of man standing on the right hand of God. Then they cried out with a loud voice, and stopped their ears, and ran upon him with one accord, and cast him out of the city, and stoned him: . . And they stoned Stephen, calling upon God, and saying, Lord Jesus, receive my spirit. And he kneeled down, and cried with a loud voice, Lord, lay not this sin to their charge. 




Something to Remember

When we become a new creature in Christ Jesus old things are passed away (II Corinthians 5:17). Even our tongues speak things to glorify God and to help mankind. We speak with new tongues (Mark 16:17). No longer do we speak evil of one another, to hurt and damage a person's reputation. Sometimes God allows us to speak with other tongues like the disciples on the day of Pentecost so others can hear the Word in their tongue (Acts 2:4-11; 10:46).

The New Man Speaks In Righteousness and True Holiness

The spirit of our minds has been renewed; we have put off any behavior of our former carnal nature which is corrupt according to deceitful lusts and desires. We have now put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness. Read Ephesians 4:20-32. Verses 25, 29-31 read thus: "Wherefore putting away lying, speak every man truth with his neighbor: for we are members one of another. . . . Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers. And grieve not the Holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption. Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamor, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice." Being a new creature in Christ changes our whole manner of life!

". . . bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ" (II Corinthians 10:5).

Resist every bad thought—start praising God—think on good things!




Always listen to God—never listen to Satan. "THOU GOD SEEST ME" (Genesis 16:13).

WHAT TO DO WITH BAD THOUGHTS

Throw away every bad thought that comes to you! It is Satan's trick to bring bad thoughts to our minds. A bad thought is not our thought unless we want it to be our thought. We can decide to throw away that bad thought or we can decide to make it ours. Pray to Jesus. He will help you throw away any bad thought. REMEMBER: "We cannot help it if the birds fly over our heads but we can prevent them from making a nest in our hair." So it is with the bad thoughts. They may come flying to us and want to enter our minds but we can refuse them. Right away think on the good things. Jesus tells us what to think about.

A. If our thoughts have been bad—"Let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts: and let him return unto the LORD, and He will have mercy upon him; and to our God, for He will abundantly pardon" (Isaiah 55:7).

B. God can help us keep the thoughts of our minds pure and good as we keep our minds on Him. Feed your soul upon the Word of God. His Word is powerful to discern the thoughts and intents of our hearts (Hebrews 4:12). As you do this, bring your every thought "into obedience to Christ." II Corinthians 10:5 explains this: "Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ."







What Happens If We Fail the Lord in Some Way?

Answer: Our hearts can be repaired by the following ways:

- 1. Go to the Lord in prayer right away and tell Him you are sorry.
- 2. Ask Him to put your failure under His blood and to help you never to do that thing again. Trust Him and He will give you grace to overcome.
- 3. If you did wrong to someone, ask the Lord to help you go and ask forgiveness.
- 4. Make sure everything is confessed to the Lord and to anyone you may have hurt.
- 5. Jesus Christ will cleanse away this failure. "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (I John 1:9).
- 6. ". . . if any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous" (I John 2:1). Jesus will plead our case before God, our Father.
- 7. Jesus Christ will intercede for you. "For there is one God, and one Mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus" (I Timothy 2:5).
- 8. Keep walking in the light. "But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ His Son cleanseth us from all \sin " (\bar{I} John 1:7).

(God will give you grace to walk in the light. Ask Him.)

"... God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble" (James 4:6).

Something to Remember

Walking in the light means walking in obedience to Christ. This will be a joy when we are completely surrendered in doing His will. We no longer want to do our "own thing" but we want to do anything the Lord wants us to do. Our every desire will be to please Him. "... doing the will of God from the heart" (Ephesians 6:6). "Even Christ pleased not Himself" (Romans 15:3). Jesus said in John 8:29, "And He that sent Me is with Me: the Father hath not left Me alone; for I do always those things that please Him." God's testimony verifies the fact that Jesus, His only begotten Son, pleased Him. II Peter 1:17—"For He received from God the Father honor and glory, when there came such a voice to Him from the excellent glory, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."

We, too, must walk in obedience to Christ. Luke 6:46—"Why call ye Me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?" To enter into the kingdom of heaven we must make sure we do the will of God. Matthew 7:21—"Not every one that saith unto Me, Lord, Lord, shall enter in to the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of My Father which is in heaven."

Obedience to the Lord is necessary to be an overcomer (Matthew 7:21).

JESUS TEACHES US TO PRAY



Matthew 6:9-13
Jesus told His disciples to pray in this way:

9. "Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy name. 10. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven. 11. Give us this day our daily bread. 12. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. 13. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: for Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen."

The above prayer should be memorized. Throughout the world this prayer that Jesus taught His disciples is prayed in nearly every Bible-believing church. Often a body of believers will pray this prayer in unison.

Jesus also wants us to pray to Him for any need we may have. But when we ask Him we must ask in faith, believing He has heard our prayer and will answer it according to His will. (Read I John 5:14, 15.)

PRAYER IS HEART-COMMUNION WITH GOD

The Psalms are full of prayers and rejoicing. We can pray while sitting, standing, kneeling, or in any posture.

- 1. King David prayed a wonderful prayer as he sat before the Lord—II Samuel 7:18-29. He often praised the Lord in his prayers. He wrote most of the Psalms.
- 2. On the day King Solomon dedicated the house of the Lord he stood with his hands spread forth toward heaven. Somewhere during this prayer he kneeled on his knees still with his hands spread out to heaven—I Kings 8:22-54.
- 3. Daniel prayed three times a day upon his knees and gave thanks—Daniel 6:10.
- 4. Jonah prayed unto the Lord out of the great fish's belly-Jonah chapter 2.



Something to Remember

GOD ALWAYS HAS TIME TO LISTEN WHEN WE TAKE TIME TO PRAY.

- 1. His ear is open to our prayers. Psalm 116:1 and 2 tells of David—"I love the LORD, because He hath heard my voice and my supplications. Because He hath inclined His
- ear unto me, therefore will I call upon Him as long as I live."

 2. Since the Lord neither slumbers nor sleeps (Psalm 121:4) we can pray anytime to Him. Isaiah 59:1—"Behold, the LORD's hand is not shortened, that it cannot save; neither His ear heavy, that it cannot hear."
- 3. God is seeking to show Himself strong in our behalf. II Chronicles 16:9—"For the eyes of the LORD run to and fro throughout the whole earth, to show Himself strong in the behalf of them whose heart is perfect toward Him."

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS (Exodus 20) The Basis of Moral Law



Bible definition of sin—I John 3:4 ". . . sin is the transgression (breaking) of the law."
(Other Bible definitions of sin are found on pages 47, 49, 52.)

Jesus was tempted in all points like as we are, yet without sin (Hebrews 4:15). Read Matthew chapter 4, verses 1-11 about Jesus being tempted of the devil.

A Secret Jesus Used

Every time the devil tempted Jesus to do wrong, Jesus used the Word of God. This is what you and I must do. We must hide God's WORD in our hearts so we can be strong. When a temptation comes to us it is not yet a sin . . . but if we obey the temptation, then it is a sin. Jesus never obeyed any temptation of the devil.

Remember This:


Any voice that comes to you to try and get you to do wrong is the voice of Satan. It is not God's voice! Right away pray to Jesus to make you strong so that you will not obey the voice of Satan. When Satan sees that he cannot tempt you to do wrong, he will go away. Command him in the name of Jesus to leave and get behind you. He will go away and leave you just like the devil went away and left Jesus.

"Resist the devil and he will flee from you. Draw nigh to God, and He will draw nigh to you"



IDOL WORSHIP FORBIDDEN

"Thou shalt have no other gods before Me" (Exodus 20:3).

(An idol is an image, an object, or anything that takes the place of God in your life.)



Idols are vain and cannot hear us. They are the work of men's hands (Psalm 115).

Bible Readings (instructions on page 1.)

- 12 I John 5:21—We are to keep ourselves from idols.
- 12 Exodus 20:3-6—We must not bow down to idols nor serve them. Future generations will suffer.
- 12 Psalm 115:3-8—Idols are the work of men's hands.
- 12 Deuteronomy 7:24-26—Bring no idols into your house.
- 12 Deuteronomy 12:2, 3, 30, 31—Human sacrifices are forbidden. It is a fearful thing to take a life.
- 12 Micah 6:7, 8—Children are not to be sacrificed for sin. No human sacrifice can atone for sin.
- 12 Exodus 22:20—Anyone sacrificing to any god, except the Lord, will be destroyed.
- 12 Revelation 21:8—Punishment for idol worship

Witchcraft, Devil or Satan Worship Are Abominations to God

- 12 Deuteronomy 18:9-13—Abominations which God hates.
- Psalm 106:36, 37 and 40—Sacrifice to devils brings the wrath of God.
- 12 I Samuel 15:23—Rebellion is as the sin of witchcraft.
- I Corinthians 10:14, 20—Have no fellowship with devils.
 - Beware of Seducing Spirits—and Evil Spirits
- I Timothy 4:1-8—Some will depart from the faith by giving heed to doctrines of devils.
- Isaiah 8:19—We must not seek after familiar spirits and those that peep and mutter. We are to seek after God.
- 12 Î Cĥronicles 10:13, 14—King Saul died because he asked counsel of one who had a familiar spirit.
- Mark 13:22—False christs and false prophets shall rise to seduce (to tempt to wrong-doing).

How to Cast Out Evil and Unclean Spirits

- 12 Acts 16:18—Command them to come out in the name of Jesus Christ.
- Mark 9:25-27, 29—Pray and fast before rebuking the unclean spirit.
- 12 John 14:13—There is great power in the name of Jesus. Pray in His name.
- 12 Luke 9:1 and 10:19, 20—Christ gives authority and power over all the power of the enemy.

WORSHIP GOD ONLY (Revelation 22:1-14).

Be on the winning side—worship the true and living God Who created the heavens and the earth (Acts 4:24-31).

Satan is only a creature and will be cast into the lake of fire (Revelation 20:10). "And whosoever was not found written in the book of life was cast into the lake of fire" (Revelation 20:15). "The wicked shall be turned into hell, and all the nations that forget God" (Psalm 9:17).

ALL NATIONS THAT FORGET GOD SHALL BE TURNED INTO HELL.



PRAYER OF KING DAVID

"Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me" (Psalm 51:10).

Have you ever asked the Lord for a clean heart?

Something to Remember

This prayer of King David for a clean heart and a right spirit can be our prayer, too. He had committed a terrible sin of adultery with Uriah's wife; then he tried to cover up his sin by having Uriah put in the front of the hottest battle so he would be killed. One terrible sin led to another (II Samuel, chapters 11 and 12). This all displeased the Lord (II Samuel 11:27) and David was sorely punished for his sin (II Samuel 12:9-12; 14-19). David repented of his sin (II Samuel 12:13). Therefore God forgave David and put away his sin. Blessing once again came upon David. David's prayer for a clean heart and a right spirit was answered. King David later became a man after God's own heart (Acts 13:22). In fact, God saw in David a man who would fulfil His will. From David's seed the Saviour, Jesus Christ, was born (Acts 13:22, 23).

OUR BODIES ARE THE TEMPLE OF GOD

"Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you?" (I Corinthians 3:16).



One way to glorify God is to offer Him thanks for our daily bread and to eat only that which is good for our bodies.

Bible Readings: (see page 1 for instructions).

- I Corinthians 6:13-15—Our bodies are members of Christ, for the Lord and not for fornication.
- 12 I Corinthians 6:18—Flee fornication (sexual relations on the part of any unmarried person). The person who commits fornication sins against his own body.
- 1 John 5:17—All unrighteousness is sin! (a Bible definition)
- 12 I Corinthians 6:9, 10—The unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of heaven. These two verses tell who the unrighteous are.
- 12 I Corinthians 6:19, 20—We are not our own; we are bought with a price.
- 12 Exodus 20:14—Thou shalt not commit adultery (sexual relations with someone other than the marriage partner).
- 12 Malachi 3:5—God is a swift witness against adultery.
- Romans 1:24-27—Wrong for women to dishonor their bodies between themselves and for men to

lust after other men. This is called homosexuality (sexual actions with one of the same sex)

[1] Romans 1:28-32; Galatians 5:19-21—These verses also tell who the unrighteous people are. In this state they cannot inherit the kingdom of God.

It Is God's Will That We Have Clean, Holy Bodies

- 12 I Thessalonians 4:3—It is God's will that we be set apart for Him.
- 12 Leviticus 19:29—Parents are to shield daughters from prostitution.
- 12 Proverbs 5:15-23—Sex is created for marriage only.
- 12 Hebrews 13:4-Marriage is honorable in all.
- 12 I Corinthians 7:10, 11—A wife should not depart from her husband.
- 12 Romans 7:2, 3—Only if the husband is dead can a wife marry again.

- 12 Matthew 14:3, 4-King Herod was told it was not lawful to have his brother's wife.

Christ Introduced New Concepts of Adultery and Murder

- Matthew 5:27-30—Whoever looks on a woman to lust after her has already committed adultery in his heart.
- 112 I John 3:14, 15—Whoever hates his brother is a murderer, and no murderer has eternal life abiding in him.

Something to Remember

No one can keep the commandments without Christ in his heart. Christ did not come to destroy the law, but to fulfill it \dots to make it possible for us to keep His commandments through His grace which He implants in our hearts through faith. [Review your verses found in Ephesians 2:8. 9./ His laws are now written in our hearts by the Spirit of the Living God and not just in tables of stone. Read II Corinthians chapter 3, verses 3-6. We are now His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God ordained before that we should walk in them-Ephesians 2:10.

Mark 10:17-30 tells the story of a fine rich man who came to Jesus asking, "Good Master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Evidently he had observed all the last six of the ten commandments which have to do with our relationship with our fellowman, for he told the Lord: "All these have I kept from my youth up." Jesus, beholding him, loved him! However, when Jesus tested him on his relationship to God, he failed the test. He was not prepared to love the Lord with all his heart!

Jesus had tested this fine rich man by saying, "Go sell that which thou hast and give to the poor, and come, take up thy cross, and follow Me." Evidently money and possessions were his gods! He went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions! He could not face up to the first commandment, "Thou shalt have no other gods before Me"!

Just think! He could have had treasure in heaven and also have been a disciple of Jesus. Jesus calls us all to follow Him. What you and I choose to do decides our destiny. We can choose to follow Christ or not to follow Christ. If we do not enter the kingdom of God it will not be the Lord's fault. Our own choices will condemn us! "He is not willing that any should perish" (II Peter 3:9). [See page 15 again.]

CHRIST IN YOU—THE HOPE OF GLORY—Colossians 1:27.

Jesus Christ can save anyone who will receive Him into his heart and life! He can save the good moral man or the man who has broken all the commandments! I Corinthians 1:11 says, "And such were some of you: But ye are washed, but ye are sanctified, but ye are justified in the name of the Lord Jesus, and by the Spirit of our God." Yes, receiving Christ means being clothed in His righteousness (Romans 10:3-10).

WHAT GOD SAYS ABOUT LOVE

The two greatest commandments are about love to God and love to man.
(Matthew 22:35-40)

"Then one of them, which was a lawyer, asked Him a question, tempting Him, and saying, Master, which is the greatest commandment in the law? Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

Something to Remember

The ten commandments we learned on page 44 can be divided into two parts: A. The first four commandments speak about our relationship to God.

B. The other six commandments speak about our relationship to our fellowman. Jesus sums up all ten commandments into the two greatest commandments as you read above. Everyone should memorize the first and great commandment (Matthew 22:37) which has to do with our relationship to God. Also everyone should memorize the second great commandment (Matthew 22:39) which has to do with our relationship to our fellowman.

So we can now plainly see that love truly is the fulfilling of the law (Romans 13:8).



(Ephesians 5:18)

The Spirit—what does 'the Spirit' mean?

"God is a Spirit: and they that worship Him must worship Him in spirit and in truth" (John 4:24).

Also "God is love." "And we have known and believed the love that God has to us. God is love; and he that dwelleth in love dwelleth in God, and God in him" (I John 4:16). So when we get filled with "the Spirit," we will be filled with God the Holy Spirit, filled with His love

Filled means "Full-up."

It is possible for us to be filled with "all the fullness of God."

"That He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with might by His Spirit in the inner man; ¹⁷That Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith; that ye, being rooted and grounded in love, ¹⁸May be able to comprehend with all saints what is the breadth, and length, and depth, and height; and to know the love of Christ, which passeth knowledge, that ye might be FILLED with all the fullness of God" (Ephesians 4:16-19).

The fullness of God consists of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost. These three are ONE. Pages 7, 9, and 10 already told us about God, Jesus Christ, and the Holy Ghost being one.

Before Jesus Christ came to this earth He was called the WORD in heaven (I John 5:7). "For there are three that bear record in heaven, the **Father**, the **WORD**, and the **Holy Ghost**: and **these three are one**." "The WORD [Jesus Christ] was made flesh and dwelt among us..." (John 1:14).

The earthly name of the WORD was Jesus. "Thou shalt call His name JESUS: for He shall save His people from their sins" (Matthew 1:21).

At the baptism of Jesus in the river Jordan, the God-head was present: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost. Read Matthew, chapter 3, verses 1-6 and 13-17.

- (1) God the Father, who spoke from heaven, saying, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."
- (2) God the Son (the WORD who was made flesh), who was being baptized by John the Baptist.
- (3) God the Holy Spirit, who came down from heaven like a dove, resting upon Jesus.

Something to Remember

At the time we are "born again" (John 3:7) and accept Jesus Christ as our Savior through faith (Ephesians 2:8, 9) the Holy Spirit enters into our hearts. This has to be true because Romans 8:9 says—"... Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, he is none of His." Therefore, when we are "born again" we have the Spirit of Christ. But when we become "filled" with the Spirit, Christ has all of us! He has every room or department or area of our lives! For example: suppose you buy a house and get a key only for the front door which leads into the first room. The other doors are still locked, so you do not fully occupy the whole house until every door can be opened and you take FULL possession. Likewise, we must make a full commitment of our lives to God. We must completely surrender our will to Christ so that His will can be worked out in us. Then, and only then, does He have all the keys to every area of our lives and HE has pre-eminence (first place). Christ can only gain full possession of our hearts as we become emptied of self, selfish ambitions, self-will, and are thoroughly purged from the carnal traits in our "heart life" such as pride, envy, jealousy, anger, desires to destroy life or hurt people, or any attitude unlike Christ, Read I Corinthians 3:1-5. Everything must be purged, and cleansed out of our hearts. By faith we must trust Christ to do this for us! When this happens we can bring forth more fruit for our Lord. Christ tells us in John 15:1 and 2, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the husbandman. Every branch in me that beareth not fruit He taketh away, and every branch that beareth fruit. He purgeth it, that it may bring forth more fruit." God must have clean vessels for His use-II Timothy 2:19-22.

How We May Be "Purged" and "Filled with the Spirit"

(Bible Readings will tell the answer.)

- Romans 6:6-13, 22—Yield ourselves unto God and reckon ourselves to be dead to sin, knowing that our old carnal nature is crucified with Christ.
- Romans 7:14-24—Paul recognized carnal traits in his heart life which made him wretched and miserable. Like him, we too must cry out to be delivered.
- Romans 7:25 and Romans 8:1-6—Paul found deliverance through Jesus Christ our Lord. Christ died to free us so that sin would no longer have dominion over us! (Romans 6:11-18).
- Luke 11:9-12—Ask to be filled with the Spirit. "... how much more shall your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to them that ask Him?"
- 112 Acts 15:8, 9—By faith accept His purifying of our hearts. Believe the work is done. "And God, which knoweth the hearts, bare them witness, giving them the Holy Ghost, even as He did unto us, and put no difference between us and them, purifying their hearts by faith." We are sanctified by faith which is in Christ (Acts 26:18).
- Romans 12:1, 2—Totally commit our lives to Christ by surrendering our wills to His will for us—"... brethren, by the mercies of God,... present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect will of God."

True commitment to Christ means He can count on us to be true to Him in every circumstance in life or death. Read Romans 8:32-39.

Isaiah 6:1-8—Isaiah, the prophet, had a mighty experience. His vision of the holiness of God made him realize his undoneness, and he cried out to be clean. He was made clean. This experience of his sin being purged made it possible and easy for Isaiah to offer himself to be used of the Lord. "Here am I, send me." This is total commitment or complete surrender to the will and call of God.

ALWAYS REMEMBER THIS

The two commands—"Ye must be born again" (John 3:7) and "Be filled with the Spirit" (Ephesians 5:18) are both provided for through the Lord Jesus Christ by faith. [See pages 21, 22 and 53-56.]







Words of Caution to Remember

We do not attain absolute or sinless perfection here on earth in this present life. But God does expect our hearts to be perfect toward Him. Deuteronomy 18:13 says, "Thou shalt be perfect with the LORD thy God." In this life we can be mistaken in our ways of doing things and our plans to improve our life-style may fail. We may err in judgment and therefore fail in business or perhaps misunderstand a question in school exams and receive a lower grade because of it! But with all our human mistakes and errors in judgment God still wants us to have a perfect heart and keep His commandments (I Kings 8:61). God shows Himself strong toward those whose hearts are perfect toward Him—II Chronicles 16:9.

In this life we are still "pressing toward the mark." Our goal is to attain perfection. Read Philippians 3:12-15, 20, and 21—we shall have a body like His glorious body!

Someday we will have absolute perfection. David the Psalmist said, "... I will be satisfied when I awake in Thy likeness" (Psalm 17:15). But right now in this life, since Jesus Christ offered Himself for our sanctification (Hebrews 10:10), we can have the perfection which pleases Him (Hebrews 10:14-24; I John 4:16-18; II Timothy 3:16, 17).

"... Walk worthy of the Lord...." (Colossians 1:10).

"...I am the Almighty God; walk before Me, and be thou perfect" (Genesis 17:1).

A. THE FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT



". . . By their fruits ye shall know them." (Read Matthew 7:17-20.)

Everyone filled with the Spirit will manifest the fruit of the Spirit.

"The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: against such there is no law" (Galatians 5:22, 23).

The evidence of being filled with the Spirit is producing fruit unto holiness. "But now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, ye have your fruit unto holiness, and the end everlasting life" (Romans 6:22).

We will follow after righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, meekness, fighting the good fight of faith. (Read I Timothy 6:11-21.)

When we are filled with the Spirit we will walk in the Spirit (Galatians 5:25). In Psalm 101, verses 2 and 3, David said, "I will behave myself wisely in a perfect way... I will walk within my house with a perfect heart. I will set no wicked thing before my eyes...." The way we conduct our private lives is important to God! "Thou, God, seest me" (Genesis 16:13).

We shall bring forth fruit with patience—Luke 8:15. Of all the fruit, the greatest is love. Read the great love chapter on page 51. [The word charity means love.]

"And now abideth faith, hope, love, these three: but the *greatest* of these is love" (I Corinthians 13:13).

B. THE GIFTS OF THE SPIRIT

Not all believers have the same gift, and no believer has all the gifts. Gifts are given by the Spirit as He wills (I Corinthians 12:11). We must be good stewards of the gift God gives to us by using it to minister to others in such a way that it will glorify God. I Peter 4:10, 11 says: "As every man hath received the gift, even so minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God. If any man speak, let him speak as the oracles of God; if any man minister let him do it as of the ability which God giveth: that God in all things may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to Whom be praise and dominion for ever and ever. Amen."

I CORINTHIANS CHAPTER 12 DESCRIBES THE GIFTS.

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brethren, I would not have you ignorant. 2Ye know that ve were Gentiles, carried away unto these dumb idols, even as ve were led. Wherefore I give you to understand, that no man speaking by the Spirit of God calleth Jesus accursed: and that no man can say that Jesus is the Lord, but by the Holy Ghost. Now there are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit, And there are differences of administrations. but the same Lord. And there are diversities of operations, but it is the same God which worketh all in all 'But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal. For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another the word of knowledge by the same Spirit; 9To another faith by the same Spirit; to another the gifts of healing by the same Spirit: 10 To another the working of miracles: to another prophecy: to another discerning of spirits; to another divers kinds of tongues; to another the interpretation of tongues: "But all these worketh that one and the selfsame Spirit, dividing to every man severally as He will. 12 For as the body is one, and hath many members, and all the members of that one body, being many, are one body; so also is Christ. 13 For by one Spirit are we all baptized into one body, whether we be Jews or Gentiles, whether we be bond or free; and have been all made to drink into one Spirit. 14For the body is not one member, but many. 15 If the foot shall say, Because I am not the hand, I am not of the body; is it therefore not of the body? 18 And if the ear shall say, Because I am not the eye, I am not of the body; is it therefore not of the body? (continued on next page)

Read I Corinthians chapter 13 on page 51. This chapter shows the "more excellent way." LOVE is the greatest and ultimate way of living! "... What doth the LORD thy God require of thee, but to fear the LORD thy God, to walk in all His ways, and to love Him, and to serve the LORD thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul" (Deuteronomy 10:12). "Love one another with a pure heart" (I Peter 1:22).

Something to Remember

The evidence of being "filled with the Spirit" is having the fruit of the Spirit, and not any one gift of the Spirit. Did you read I Corinthians chapter 13 on page 51? Verse 1 reads: "Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, and have not love, I am become as sounding brass, or a tinkling cymbal." Verse 2 reads: "Though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries, and all knowledge; and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, and have not love, I am nothing." FRUIT is what God must have. Read Matthew 7:15-23.

There is no salvation for our souls apart from Jesus Christ

- 112 John 10:10; Galatians 2:20—It is Christ who came, loved us, and died for us.

World Book Dictionary, Volume 2, page 1824, says: (1) Sanctification is "the act of making holy; purification from sin." (2) To be sanctified also means: "set apart for sacred services: consecrated."

Something to Remember

The real baptism of the Holy Spirit will be a baptism of LOVE! God is love, and our hearts can be made perfect in love. I John 4:16-18—"And we have known and believed the love that God has to us. GOD IS LOVE; and he that dwelleth in love dwelleth in God, and God in him. 'Herein is our love made perfect, that we may have boldness in the day of judgment: because as He is, so are we in this world. 'B'There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear: because fear hath torment. He that feareth is not made perfect in love."

A. Love for our brother—I John 4:20, 21; I John 3:14-18; and I Peter 1:22.

B. Love for our enemies—Matthew 5:43-48. (These verses tell how or in what manner Christ is telling us to be perfect even as our Father which is in heaven is perfect.)

C. Love for God and our neighbor—Being filled with His Spirit will enable us to keep the two greatest commandments ever given to man. (These two are given on page 51.) Romans 13:10 says, "Love worketh no ill to his neighbor: therefore LOVE is the fulfilling of the law."

A SECRET PAUL LEARNED

Paul learned that not only must we reckon ourselves to be dead to sin and alive to God (Romans 6:11 and I Peter 2:24) but that this is to be a continuing experience. "I DIE DAILY" (I Corinthians 15:31) was Paul's experience. Each day we are to take up our cross and follow Christ (Luke 9:23-26). Our cross is choosing to do what God wants and not choosing our own ways. We can say, like Christ, "Not my will but Thine be done" (Luke 22:42). Paul went all out for Jesus Christ. [Read Philippians 3:8-10.] Galatians 2:20—"I am crucified with Christ, nevertheless I live, Yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God. who loved me, and gave Himself for me."

A prayer guide to be filled with the Spirit and to enter a life of victory

(Go over your memory verses again on page 56 for additional help.)

"Dear Lord Jesus, I yield my whole self to Thee. I place all the members of my body at Your disposal as a living sacrifice. Take my hands, my feet, my voice, my eyes, my lips, my ears, everything I am and hope to be. I lay my whole life at Thy feet to be used as You see fit.

By the power of Thy Holy Spirit, deliver my old carnal nature (my self-life) to the death and enable me to reckon myself crucified with Thee, buried with Thee, and risen with Thee. Grant that from now on my life will no longer be lived to please self and selfish ambitions but to do your will and to bring glory to your name. Grant that I may live in union with Thee, so that daily I can say, 'Not I but Christ liveth in me.'

I thank Thee, Lord Jesus, for accepting my prayer of dedication and total commitment. By faith I reckon my old self-life to be dead and crucified with Thee. By faith I believe you have cleansed my heart and soul from pride, jealousy, anger, any unChrist-like attitude, and from all secret sin through your precious blood which makes me clean!

By faith I believe you have filled me with your Holy Spirit. From this day onward I trust Thee fully to guide me—with Your Spirit flowing through me daily to walk in obedience to Your will, and to do those things pleasing in Your sight—so that I can bring glory and honor to Your name!

I pray this in Jesus' name, Amen."

Matthew 21:22—"And all things, whatsoever ye shall ask in prayer, believing, ye shall receive. I John 2:17—"He that doeth the will of God abideth forever." Hebrews 5:9—"... He became the author of eternal salvation unto all them that obey Him." Romans 12:1—"... Present your bodies a living sacrifice...."

PERSECUTION AND SUFFERING

Jesus said in John 15:18-21, "If the world hate you, you know that it hated Me before it hated you: if you were of the world, the world would love his own: but because you are not of the world... the world hateth you... the servant is not greater than his lord. If they have persecuted Me, they will also persecute you... all these things will they do to you for My name's sake, because they know not Him that sent Me."

"If you are reproached for the name of Christ, happy are ye: for the Spirit of glory and of God resteth upon you: on their part He is evil spoken of, but on your part He is glorified" (I Peter 4:14). "The same afflictions are accomplished in your brethren that are in the world" (I Peter 5:9). We are still to rejoice (I Peter 4:12. 13).

CHRIST SUFFERED FOR US

(I Peter 2:21-24)

"... Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that you should follow His steps: Who did no sin, neither was guile found in His mouth: Who, when He was reviled, reviled not again: when He suffered, He threatened not; but committed Himself to Him that judgeth righteously: Who His own Self bare our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes you were healed."

Something to Remember

Sinful man is responsible for the evil on this earth. No one can blame God for all the suffering and hardships. The earth was given to the children of men. What a mess they have made (Psalm 115:15, 16).

Hebrews 10:25— "Forsake not the assembling of yourselves together." "... The church which is in his house" (Colossians 4:15).

(In Bible days believers often had church in their houses. Read Romans 16:5; I Corinthians 16:19; Philemon verse 2.)

The historical record of the early Christians (first called Christians at Antioch —Acts 11:26) shows clearly that the first day of the week (Sunday) became the Christian's day of worship. This is often called the Lord's Day because this is the day the Lord Jesus Christ arose from the dead.

Bible Readings

- 112 Matthew 28:1-6; Acts 20:7; I Corinthians 16:2—References about the first day of the week.
- 112 Romans 14:5-7—Let no man judge us as to which day of worship we keep.
- Matthew 16:15-18; Pslam 18:31; II Samuel 22:31-33—God is the Rock upon which the church is built.

The Two Resurrections

Everybody shall be raised from the dead. Acts 24:15 says—"... There shall be a resurrection of the dead, both of the just and unjust: (1) some to the resurrection of life; (2) some to the resurrection of damnation. John 5:28, 29—"Marvel not at this: for the hour is coming, in the which all that are in the graves shall hear His voice, and shall come forth; they that have done good, unto the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil, unto the resurrection of damnation."

1. The dead in Christ shall rise first (I Thessalonians 4:16). Revelation 20:4-6—"And I saw thrones, and they sat upon them, and judgment was given unto them: and I saw the souls of them that were beheaded for the witness of Jesus, and for the Word of God, and which had not worshipped the beast, neither his image, neither had received his mark upon their foreheads, or in their hands; and they lived and reigned with Christ a thousand years. But the rest of the dead lived not again until the thousand years were finished. This is the first resurrection. Blessed and holy is he that hath part in the first resurrection: on such the second death hath no power. . . ."

2. All others experience the second death—Revelation 20:10-15.

What the second death (Hell) is like:

- Luke 16:19-26—Hell is a place of torment. The rich man died, "and in hell he lift up his eyes, being in torments...."
- Matthew 24:48-51—A place of weeping and gnashing of teeth.
- Matthew 13:37-42—A furnace of fire.
- 12 Matthew 25:30—A place of outer darkness.
- Revelation 14:11—The smoke of their torment ascendeth up forever and ever. "... and they have no rest day nor night, who worship the beast and his image, and whosoever receive th the mark of his name."
- Matthew 25:31-46—A place of everlasting punishment.
- Revelation 20:15; Mark 9:44, 46, 48—The second death is the lake of fire.
- Revelation 21:8—Those who will have their part in the lake of fire.
- 112 Proverbs 6:16-19; 11:1, 20; 12:22; 15:8, 9, 26—People who are abominable to God.

All believers have an inheritance incorruptible reserved in heaven for them —/ Peter 1:4.


